Salvation Is Created Pavel Tschesnokoff (1877-1944) arranged by Bruce Houseknecht Pavel Tschesnokoff was a Russian composer and choirmaster who led many choral groups in Russia. This piece was originally written as vocal music for the Russian Orthodox Church. The English translation is: "Salvation is created, in the midst of the earth, O God, O our God. Alleluia."

A collection of seasonal songs expertly arranged by Sammy Nestico; *Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer, I'll Be Home For Christmas, Frosty The Snow Man, Winter Wonderland, The Christmas Song.*

Rhapsody in Blue (1924) George Gershwin (1898-1937), scored for wind band by Donald Hunsberger Annie Guo, Piano

Rhapsody in Blue marked the 25-year-old Gershwin's debut as a "serious" concert artist and composer. The occasion was a highly publicized concert on February 12, 1924 at New York's Aeolian Hall devised by band director Paul Whiteman and given the rather ominous title "Experiment in Modern Music." Whiteman wanted to demonstrate to the New York musical establishment that American jazz had come of age and was worthy of the same respect as European art music. The title referred not just to the blue notes of jazz, but also to the composer's love of the visual arts; having recently attended a Whistler exhibit with paintings such as "Nocturne in Black and Gold," he chose "Rhapsody in Blue."

Annie Guo is a senior at Campolindo High School in Moraga, CA. She began piano lessons with Anita Wait at the age of five and then transferred to Barbara Parker when she was ten. She had participated and was a winner in

the Portland Classical Festival, Baroque Festival, and Romantic Festival. She currently studies with Dr. Betty Woo.



Annie received 1st place in the U.S. Open Music Competition in 2011 and won the MTAC Memorial Scholarship foundation award the same year. She was also a winner in the Junior Bach Festival in 2012 and the Campolindo Concerto Contest.

Annie Guo is also an outstanding flutist performing with the Walnut Creek Concert Band, Campolindo Symphonic Band, Orchestra and Jazz band (jazz piano). In 2010, Annie traveled with the Campolindo Orchestra to Beijing, China along with violinist Jeremy Cohen and Bassist Barry Green, performing Aaron Copland's Appalachian Spring and Bach's Brandenburg Concerto No. 4

Conductors . . .

Harvey Benstein brings to the podium a wealth



of experience and artistry. His musical interpretations and artistic conducting style have won the praises of composers, conductors, musicians and audiences. Ensembles under his direction demonstrate a wide

range of musical styles, sensitive musicianship, and ensemble clarity, creating innovative and eclectic programs. Benstein has conducted in all media from Symphony Orchestra to jazz ensemble and is well versed in the orchestral and wind band repertoire. Active in the San Francisco Bay area as a professional conductor, Benstein has served as the music director and conductor of the Walnut Creek Concert Band since 1998, and was the conductor of the Contra Costa Chamber Orchestra (1999-2007). He has recently retired as the instrumental music director at Campolindo High School, where he established an instrumental music program that has received a National and International reputation for excellence.

Benstein served as Professor of Conducting and Ensemble director at Butler University, Indiana; McNeese State University, Louisiana; and The Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio, mentoring numerous conductors and musicians and establishing a comprehensive conductor-training program.

He is in demand as a guest conductor and clinician throughout the United States, working with professional and amateur ensembles. Recent engagements include a Concert tour with the United State Air Force Band of the Golden West and a Conducting Symposium at Travis AFB, CA. He has conducted in such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall, Sydney Town Hall and the Sydney Opera

House; Glinka Concert Hall, St. Petersburg, Russia; Beijing Conservatory and Military Concert Hall in Beijing, China, and has led performance tours to Mexico, Denmark, Norway and Sweden.

G. Mancho Gonzalez completes his second year serving as the associate conductor for the Walnut



Creek Concert Band. He is the Music Director and Conductor of the San Francisco Civic Symphony, gives music clinics to bay area instrumental music programs, a freelance

musician and conductor, and teaches private conducting lessons. In January 2009 he relocated back to the bay area from Oregon where he was the director of the Eugene Symphonic Band and taught instrumental music in the Portland area. His previous teaching experiences include Oregon State University, where he conducted the Symphonic Wind Ensemble and taught conducting and instrumental music education courses. He had a similar sabbatical leave appointment at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota. For much of his career, he taught in public schools and community college in the Sacramento area. Dr. Gonzalez has had plentiful experience with bands as conductor, trumpet player, and adjudicator in California, Arizona, Minnesota, Washington, and Oregon. His love for community bands began as a youngster and has performed in them since the age of 12. He has an undergraduate music degree from San Jose State, a Master's degree in conducting from California State College, Sacramento, and a Doctor of Musical Arts in Music Education from Arizona State University. His conducting mentors are Robert Halseth and Gary Hill. He also enjoyed symposiums/workshops conducting Frederick Fennell, Jack Stamp, Eugene Corporon, Allan McMurray, John Whitwell, and David Whitwell.

Long Time Walnut Creek Band Member and Trombone Section Leader, William David Burke of Concord died on October 1, 2012, at the age of 87. He was born in Alameda, CA. He graduated from Alameda High in 1943, and was in the Army Air Corps from 1943 to 1945, leaving the service as a Pilot, Second Lieutenant. In 1951 he joined the Mount Diablo School District as a music teacher. His Ygnacio Valley High School Jazz Band performed at the Monterey Jazz Festival in 1970 and took first place. He helped found the Diablo Symphony organization in 1962, a group he served as President for some time, and played trombone in that group. He also became the Superintendent of Music in 1972 for MDSD, retiring in 1986. He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Geraldine (Jerry), four children: William, of Austin, TX; Susan, of Burbank, CA; Michael, of Wilton, ME; and

Patricia, of Concord; 11 grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.
